a.	Safety and Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides controlled access to the campus through gates or security personnel. • Adequate lighting across the campus, help students feel safer, particularly during evening hours. • Having security guards patrolling the campus, particularly during late hours, adds an extra layer of safety and reassurance. • Surveillance cameras installed strategically throughout the campus can act as a deterrent to criminal activity and provide evidence in case of incidents. • Offers safe transportation options, such as college buses, can help women to travel securely to and from campus, especially during late hours. • Conducts workshops, seminars, or training sessions on safety awareness, self-defense, and bystander intervention equips students with the knowledge and skills to protect themselves and others.
b.	Counseling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides support services like counselling centres or helplines that can provide assistance to students facing safety concerns or emotional distress. • The college has female counsellors on staff who are trained to address a wide range of issues that specifically affect women, such as gender-based violence, reproductive health, career planning, and gender identity. • Organizes support groups or therapy sessions specifically for women to address common challenges, promote peer support, and foster a sense of community. • Offers workshops, seminars, or discussion groups focused on topics relevant to women's mental health and well-being, such as stress management, self-esteem building, assertiveness training, and healthy relationships. • Ensures strict confidentiality and privacy measures to protect the sensitive information shared by women during counselling sessions. • Ensures that counselling services are culturally sensitive and inclusive, taking into account the

Common Rooms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides common rooms for women, providing them with a comfortable and secure environment tailored to their needs. • Comfortable seating arrangements are typically provided for relaxation and informal gatherings. • Provides common restrooms, department rooms and common staffrooms for women teachers.
d.	Daycare Centre	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offers hostel facilities for women inside the campus. • Nutritious meals and snacks are provided to the women in the hostels throughout the day, taking into account any dietary restrictions or allergies. • Strives to keep fees affordable for the students, possibly offering discounts or subsidies to those in need. • Provides resources and support for health and wellness needs, including access to healthcare professionals or guidance on parenting issues. • Offers resources or referrals for educational support services, such as tutoring or early intervention programs, if needed.

Any other relevant information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offers scholarships or grants specifically designated for women students to support their academic pursuits and alleviate financial burdens, if needed. • Organizes leadership development programs, workshops, and networking opportunities aimed at empowering women students to excel in their academic and professional endeavours. • Active engagements of various cells such as Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti-ragging cell, and Women Cell in the college to address the issues pertaining to women. • Facilitates mentorship opportunities where women students can connect with faculty, alumni, or professionals in their field of study for guidance and support.




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
