

2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES:



3 AREAS OF CO-OPERATION:

- Faculty Exchange with Partner Universities: Faculty members of first party and second party can travel between to participate in activities that can enhance their international / national experience and knowledge and also to foster relations between the parties. Student Exchange with Partner Universities: Students can be given an opportunity to travel among parties to participate in activities / events that will enhance their international / intercultural experience and knowledge. iv. 4. FUNDING:

Students will pay their registration, courses or professional practices at their home university, so that they can be recognized afterwards.
- Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the university, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
- j) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors / researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

r) The host institution agrees to assist to provide boarding, lodging and necessities and to provide work space, library and laboratory facilities as appropriate.

8 AUTONOMY:

s) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

9. TERM:

- t) This MOU shall be effective for a period of five (5)—years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5)—years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they
 might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration
 program.

Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

1. OBJECTIVE:



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NOW IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The students enrolled for this add-on course leads to the additional qualification from First party/ Membership from the respective professional organization only for the candidates appearing and clearing CPC Examination.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the First Party to get the necessary accreditations from the professional body (AAPC). The final approved syllabus by AAPC for the add-on course with the exemptions availed from professional bodies through program accreditation process will be given as Annexure 1 (Syllabus).
- 3. Second Party agrees to provide all infrastructures necessary to conduct the course at the premises of the Institution and the first party agrees to conduct all offline classes of the add-on course at the assigned location only.
- 4. The Second Party shall nominate a point of contact (POC) for co-ordination of this programme.
- 5. The admission criteria, after the approval by the first party are stated in Annexure 3. The same shall be upheld for short listing all applicants. The number of seats for the above said program is fixed by the Second Party. The complete list of students of the course shall be provided to the First Party by the Second Party. - 11. If the minimum number of students does not reach 30 Nos., we will complete all the classes through online mode.
- 12. The First Party provides exam-oriented training support to the students enrolled for the above add on course for their external examinations of the professional body. The number of hours per subject / paper/module as given in Annexure 2.
- 13. The students enrolled for the add on course are given the opportunity to attend the examinations of certificate in CPC of AAPC as a part of their program. First party (Anton's Medicode) only provides the registration services to the students who are willing for CPC Examination and the amount is a separate payment which is done by the student through online site of AAPC.
- 14. Once the registration process is complete, the first party will provide 1 month CPC examination training prior to examination date only through online mode.
- 15. The students must follow the rules and regulations of the respective professional body (AAPC) to appear for the examination and pursue the qualifications/memberships and designations.

Neither party shall be liable to the other for any delay or failure on its part in performing any of its obligations under this agreement, resulting from any cause beyond its control, including but not limited to strikes, fires, floods, earthquakes, explosions, riots, acts of Governments, war or enemy action, provided the same is issued in writing to the other party within 15 days of such incident.
