

# CARMEL COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), MALA DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH SPECIAL PROGRAMMES FOR ADVANCED AND SLOW LEARNERS REPORT 2023-2024

The department abides by the policy of the institution in identifying the advanced and slow learners of each batch based on select parameters. The newly enrolled batch of both UG and PG programmes have been given bridge courses to familiarize them with their area of study. Identification of slow and advanced learners is counted based on scores attained in the bridge course examination, common entrance test (PG students are exempted), and class test on one completed module of the courses of the prescribed syllabus taken within a month of commencement of the regular classes. The assessment of academic performance has continued over the semesters based on classroom participation, assignments, seminar presentations, class test scores and internal examination scores. After the assessment, 2 out of 10 students were identified as advanced learners and 3-4 students as slow learners in the I and II semesters respectively. From II B.A. Functional English, 4 out of 20 students demonstrated consistent performance as advanced learners while 7 students were classified as slow learners. 4 students were identified as advanced learners and 7 as slow learners out of 24 students in III B.A. Functional English. In the I M.A. English program, 3 students were categorized as advanced learners and 3 as slow learners. In the II M.A. English program, 4 students were classified as advanced learners, and 5 were identified as slow learners.

Students are monitored for their consistent performance in academics and those identified to have difficulty with the same are provided with remedial sessions in specific courses by respective faculty. The class tutors maintain a remedial record that details the activities conducted to acquit the slow learners with the course. Regularity in their attendance and improvement in performance are monitored through in-person interaction and test paper scores. Direct engagement with students enables tutors to pinpoint individual challenges and offer necessary support, guidance, and remedial measures. Class tutors also maintain close contact with the parents/guardians to update them on the progress attained by the students. Peer tutoring is another initiative that the department has set in place where advanced learners help slow learners with their studies. To help with this, advanced learners have been

partnered with and grouped with slower learners. Special attention is given to improving the LSRW skills of the learners. Each peer tutor has logged all the details from their tutoring sessions in a book, which is verified each month by the class tutor. These documents are submitted for further verification to the head of the department at the end of the semester. Additional measures such as sharing simplified notes, facilitating group work, reviewing previous year's question papers, aiding in note-taking, and conducting Q&A sessions are also implemented to boost the performance of slow learners.

The department has devised programmes tailor-made to cater to advanced learners. They are encouraged to take up advanced topics for seminar presentations and projects/dissertations and are assisted with a checklist of books and resources. PG students are given NET coaching and reference materials for the same. Advance learners have spearheaded the extension activity "Spark of English", organized in collaboration with Annamanada Grama Panchayat, as resource persons where English communication classes have been given to the slow learners of Class V of two schools - Government Samithy Higher Secondary School, Meladoor and Government U.P. School, Annamanada. They have been entrusted to take a Skill Development Training Session on "Eco-Friendly Paper Pen Making" for MGNREGA Women Workers of Ward 11 of Annamanada Grama Panchayat. The advanced learners are offered auxiliary training to hone interview skills and attend campus YIP, drives. Participation in government-sponsored programmes various seminars/workshops and inter-collegiate fests/events among students are promoted to provide them adequate exposure. They are also entrusted with peer tutoring within their respective classes.

The department has organized several workshops, seminars, faculty exchange programmes, alumnae interaction and training sessions for orienting the students in career opportunities, skill development, entrepreneurship, discipline-specific topics, research ethics and methodology. These student-centric sessions have been organized with the intent of catering to the needs of learners of various levels of academic proficiency and encouraging participatory learning. Class tutors take a keen interest in identifying areas, other than academics, where each student excels and accordingly events have been organized to extend a platform for these students. The staging of *Cinderella: A Retelling* by the department has been an initiative that aimed to familiarize the students with the aesthetics of theatre, acting, designing, art and stage management. Skit performance, poem recitals, group discussions and debates are organized with the intent to encourage their appreciation for literature and enhance articulation skills. Screening of films and short films on pertinent social/cultural

issues, followed by discussions are participatory learning platforms for students to articulate their perspectives. Students are given orientation on employing ICT tools and engage in both individual and group tasks, including blog creation, utilization of English language websites/apps, and seminar presentations employing self-generated PowerPoint presentations. The department also encourages young entrepreneurs and self-employed students, who may not belong to the academically proficient category of students, by offering them platforms to present their products/talents.





## Slow learners - Activity Report 2023-24

Recognizing this, our institution has implemented a Special Program for Slow Learners, which integrates peer tutoring, remedial teaching, and problem-solving techniques to foster academic growth and confidence among these students.

#### Program Components:

#### 1. Peer Tutoring:

- Pairing proficient students with slow learners to facilitate one-on-one or small group tutoring sessions.
- Regular monitoring and feedback to ensure the effectiveness of peer tutoring sessions.

- Identifying specific areas of difficulty for each slow learner through diagnostic assessments.
- Designing customized lesson plans targeting these areas, incorporating multisensory techniques and manipulatives where appropriate.

 Regular assessments to track progress and adjust teaching strategies accordingly.

#### 3. Q&A Paper Solving Sessions:

- Organizing regular problem-solving sessions where slow learners can practice solving sample questions and past exam papers.
- Encouraging active participation and peer collaboration during these sessions.
- Providing explanations and step-by-step guidance to help students understand problem-solving techniques.
- Creating a supportive atmosphere where students feel comfortable asking questions and seeking clarification.

#### 4. Evaluation and Monitoring:

- Regular assessment of student progress through quizzes, tests, and performance evaluations.
- Gathering feedback from both slow learners and peer tutors to identify strengths and areas for improvement.
- Adjusting program components based on ongoing evaluation and feedback to ensure continuous improvement.



# Research and Pg Department Annual Report 2023-2024

The academic year 2023-2024 has been a period of strategic intervention and comprehensive support for students in the Botany Department at Carmel College (Autonomous) Mala. This report details the identification of slow and advanced learners ,the remedial measures implemented, and additional support mechanisms such as peer tutoring, mentoring, and bridge courses that were conducted to support the students to excel in both curricular and co-curricular activities. The focus has been on enhancing the academic experience and performance of all students by addressing their unique needs.

#### **IDENTIFICATION OF LEARNERS:**

At the beginning of the academic year, we undertook a rigorous process to identify slow and advanced learners across the three years of the B.Sc. Botany program. The identification of slow and advanced learners across the first-year academic semesters was based on performance in various assessments, including bridge courses, common entrance tests. In the first semester, 2 students were identified as slow learners, and 8 as advanced learners, based on their performance in the bridge course and the common entrance test. Moving into the second semester, the classification was based on the results from the first semester, where 6 students were identified as slow learners and 4 as advanced learners.

In the third semester, the identification of slow and advanced learners was made using the results of the second semester exams, with 6 students classified as slow learners and 2 as advanced learners. For the fourth semester, the classification was based on internal assessments and third-semester exam results, with 4 students identified as slow learners and 4 students as advanced learners. In the fifth semester, students were identified based on the marks from the fourth semester, with 17 students classified as slow learners and only 1 as an advanced learner. Similarly, in the sixth semester, which was based on fifth-semester results, 16 students were identified as slow learners, and 1 as an advanced learner.

#### REMEDIAL SUPPORT FOR SLOW LEARNERS

To address the needs of slow learners, a structured remedial support program

was introduced. In the 1<sup>st</sup> B.Sc. Botany, slow learners participated in bi-weekly remedial classes focusing on fundamental concepts and study skills. These sessions aimed to build a solid academic foundation and improve their grasp of core material. For the 2<sup>nd</sup> B.Sc. Botany, remedial classes covered advanced Botany topics and practical laboratory techniques. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> B.Sc. Botany, the remedial program focused on advanced topics, research methodology, and thesis writing assistance. This approach was crucial in addressing the higher academic demands of their final year and ensuring that students could meet graduation requirements.

#### PEER TUTORING SESSIONS

An integral part of our support strategy was the implementation of peer tutoring sessions. For the peer tutoring sessions, the students were divided into heterogenous groups that included both advanced learners as well as slow learners. Slow learners received targeted help with specific problem areas, enhancing their understanding and retention of complex concepts. Interaction with peers facilitated a more engaging learning experience, which helped in building confidence and motivation among the students. The peer tutoring sessions helped in developing valuable teaching and communication skills in students.

#### MENTORING PROGRAMS

In addition to academic support, a comprehensive mentoring program was established to address both academic and non-academic needs. At the beginning of the academic year, the faculty members were each assigned as mentors for groups of students. Mentors assisted students in navigating academic hurdles by providing advice on study techniques, time management, and exam preparation. They also offered career guidance by sharing insights into career opportunities in Botany, helping with research interests, and advising on further studies and job prospects. In addition, mentors extended their support to non-academic areas, including stress management, personal growth, and involvement in extracurricular activities, thereby contributing to the overall well-being of students. The mentoring program significantly benefited students by providing a holistic support system that addressed their diverse needs, fostering both academic success and personal development.

#### **BRIDGE COURSES**

To help students acclimate to the curriculum and gain a foundational understanding of the subject, bridge courses were introduced. These courses were designed to familiarize students with core concepts, ensuring early exposure to essential topics and study methods to build their confidence and readiness for more advanced coursework. They provided a strong foundation by covering fundamental Botany concepts, lab techniques, and academic skills critical for success in the program. Additionally, the bridge courses facilitated a

smooth transition for incoming students, easing their shift from high school or other disciplines to the rigorous demands of a Botany degree.

The benefits of the bridge courses were evident in the improved preparedness of students for the irregular course work. Students reported a smoother transition into the program and a better grasp of foundational concepts, which contributed to their overall academic success.

#### OUTCOME OF THE PROGRAMME:

The academic year 2023-2024 has highlighted the importance of a multifaceted approach to supporting students. Remedial courses addressed the gaps in foundational knowledge, enhancing students' confidence and increasing retention rates by equipping them for advanced coursework. Peer tutoring helped to improve the academic performance and fostered greater engagement. Bridge courses eased the transition from high school to college by reinforcing essential skills and reducing anxiety, thereby preparing students for future academic challenges. Mentoring offered personalized guidance, boosting motivation, aiding career planning, and providing valuable networking opportunities. Collectively, these programs contribute to a supportive academic environment, leading to improved student achievement and overall satisfaction. The positive outcomes achieved underscore the value of these initiatives and provide a strong foundation for continued success in the coming academic years.


Slow Learners - Activity Report 2023-24



#### REPORT ON PROGRAMS FOR SLOW AND ADVANCED LEARNERS

The Department of Accounting & Taxation must identify slow and advanced learners in order to provide students with specialised academic help. Students are classified as advanced learners if they score 80% or higher on assessments, and as slow learners if they score less than 35%. Classification of first-semester students is determined by their performance on the common admission exam, bridge course, and class assessments. Classification for students in later semesters is based on their performance on class assessments and end-of-semester exams. This procedure guarantees a thorough assessment of the performance of the students.

Based on students' academic performance, the Department of Accounting & Taxation identifies slow and advanced learners per semester. Here are several ways to identify slow learners: 2 in the first semester, 2 in the second, 3 in the third, 3 in the fourth, and 3 in the fifth. First Semester: 2; Second Semester: 2; Third Semester: 3; Fourth Semester: 3; Fifth Semester: 2, are the designated advanced learners. To guarantee focused academic support and intervention, these students are categorised according to how well they do on assessments such as class examinations, bridge courses, and end-of-semester exams.

The Department provides tailored programs to help slow learners overcome academic challenges. Remedial sessions are provided to ensure subject clarity and reinforce fundamental ideas. Peer tutoring involves assigning more seasoned students to serve as mentors for less seasoned pupils. Simplified study guides and reference tools are offered to make studying easier. Regular monitoring is made easier by frequent evaluations and feedback, which helps to track progress and effectively close learning gaps. Additionally, counselling sessions provide tailored guidance that boosts confidence and motivation. In order to help slow learners improve their skills and achieve academic success, these initiatives aim to establish a supportive and helpful environment.

Advanced learners in the Department of Accounting & Taxation are provided with opportunities to develop their skills and excel further through various programmes. They are encouraged to take up leadership roles by leading academic events and group activities, which help enhance their organizational and teamwork abilities. Group learning activities are also promoted to foster collaboration and peer interaction, allowing advanced learners to share knowledge and support each other's growth. Participation in debates, quizzes, and other academic contests is actively



Recognizing the challenges faced by some students in grasping core concepts, the department has proactively introduced several initiatives:

**Remedial Classes**: Regular remedial classes are conducted to address specific areas of weakness identified in core subjects like Financial Accounting, Banking, Corporate Accounting and Retail management. These classes provide personalized attention and allow students to clarify doubts and receive additional support.

**Peer Tutoring**: A peer tutoring program has been established, pairing strong students with those who require assistance. This peer-to-peer learning approach fosters a collaborative environment and encourages active learning.

**Enhanced Library Services**: The department library has been equipped with a dedicated section for slow learners, providing access to simplified textbooks, reference materials, and online resources.

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED FOR ADVANCED LEARNERS AND SLOW LEARNERS

The department assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special programmes for advanced learners and slow learners. The department assesses the learning levels of the students in two ways at the time of the commencement of the classes. Students enrolled in various disciplines are identified as slow and advanced learners based on their +2 marks, the common entrance test, bridge course, and internal exams conducted by each department, semester end exam and also presentations in the classroom. This helps to identify the slow learners and to design special coaching sessions or tutorial sessions to bridge the gap between the slow learners and the advanced learners.

For Slow learners special classes and class tests are conducted. Slow learners take the advantage of tutorial classes conducted by the faculty for one to one interaction. Faculty members conduct extra classes for slow learners. Faculty members supply them study materials through whatsapp. Remedial coaching classes are arranged for them to ensure the students understand the subject. Peer tutoring is also conducted by advanced students for helping other students in the subject. Parent-Teacher meetings are held at periodic intervals to discuss the academic performance of students. Learning needs of the advanced students are further fulfilled by activities such as Seminar's participation, webinar participation, Intercollegiate competitions, skill mela, motivational classes, photoshoots, fashion show competitions and also cash prizes/ endowment prizes for semester toppers.

Programmes are conducted for both slow and advanced learners based on their requirements. 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
#### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED FOR ADVANCED LEARNERS AND SLOW LEARNERS
