

Field Trip to Nature Preserve

In celebration of World Environment Day, the Department of Botany, in collaboration with the Biodiversity Club, conducted a field trip to Kaduppukkara on June 5, 2023. The coordinators, Dr. Sinjumol Thomas and Dr. Roby T J, played a crucial role in organizing and guiding the participants throughout the field trip, ensuring its success. The aim of the trip was to explore the local flora, observe biodiversity, and enhance participants' understanding of plant life. A total of 27 participants, including both faculty and students, actively attended the field trip, showcasing a keen interest in environmental exploration. The group left the college premises at 10:00 am and reached Kaduppukkara by 10:30 am. The participants immersed themselves in observing the local flora, exploring the natural beauty of Kaduppukkara. The scenic surroundings added to the overall enjoyment of the experience. Plants belonging to various families, including Menispermaceae, Convoulvulaceae, Sapindaceae, Verbenaceae, Rubiaceae, Nympheaceae, and Clusaiaceae, were collected during the trip. The assistance of teachers in plant identification added an educational dimension to the excursion. Noteworthy plants collected included Chasalia curviflora, Cardiospermum helicacabum, and many more, contributing to a comprehensive understanding of local biodiversity. The group returned to the college by 12:30 pm.

<u>Outcome</u>: Participants successfully completed a taxonomy collection, enhancing their practical skills in plant identification and collection. The hands-on experience enriched their knowledge, providing insights into the diversity of plant life in the Kaduppukkara region. The trip served as an opportunity for participants to appreciate the beauty of plants that are commonly seen only in



Study Trip 04.01.2024 - 06.01.2024

As part of the curriculum, the B.Sc. Department of Botany organized a trip to the Indian Cardamom Research Institute (ICRI), Myladumpara, on January 4th, 2024. The trip included a total of 23 students and 2 teaching faculty members, including Dr. Sinjumol Thomas and Dr. Roby T J. The journey commenced from the college at 4:30 am and reached the destination by 9:00 am. ICRI was established in 1978 as the research wing of the Spices Board, with its headquarters at Myladumpara, Idukki District (Kerala), to undertake basic and applied research on small Cardamom. At ICRI, Dr. K. Pradeep Kumar, Dr. Manoj Oomman, and Dr. Dhanapal provided classes on cardamom. The topics covered included Germplasm Conservation & hybridization programme, Weather Monitoring & Crop Impact studies, Monitoring of Pesticide Residues, Soil Health Analysis, Post-Harvest Technologies and Farm Mechanization, Pest and Disease surveillance, Screening of germplasm for Pests and diseases, evaluation of pesticides and bioagents. They also explained the release of 8 high-yielding varieties viz., ICRI 1, ICRI 2, ICRI 3, ICRI 5, ICRI 6, and ICRI 7 & ICRI 8 for small cardamom during the period. The ICRI campus hosts various tree associations, such as Cullenia-mesua-palaguium, Hopea-Diptero Carpus-Vateria, and Myristica Polyathica-Calophyllum, adding to the diverse and enriching learning environment.

After visiting ICRI, went trekking in Ramakkalmedu, including visits to the Amappara viewpoint to study the vegetation and plant distribution in Ramakkalmedu. Stayed overnight in Ramakkalmedu. The next morning, continued our journey to Kodaikanal. On the way, visited a grape farm in Cumbum, Theni District of Tamil Nadu. In Cumbum, studied farming and processing techniques related to grapes. Then reached Kodaikanal by 1:30 pm and proceeded to study the vegetation and plant distribution in the Kodaikanal region.

On the final day, during the return journey, we visited Moir Point, Pine Forest, Guna Caves, Suicide Point, and Silver Cascade Waterfall. We began our return journey at 2:30 pm and reached our college by 10:30 pm, cherishing many unforgettable experiences. Through this study tour, the students gained detailed knowledge about plant species and explored the beauty of nature.

Outcome: Overall, the study tour successfully achieved its objectives of providing students with experiential learning experiences, exposure to diverse plant species, and insights into agricultural and horticultural practices. The trip not only enhanced botanical knowledge but also fostered a deeper appreciation for the environment and nature's beauty.

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

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DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY REPORT ON ONE DAY FIELD VISIT TO ADAK

Topic: Field Visit

On 02/08/2023, students from the third year and first year of the Zoology department embarked on a one-day field visit to ADAK, the Agency for Development of Aquaculture Kerala, located in Poyya, Mala along with Ms. Needhu Das C. D and Ms. Ayrin Jose. ADAK is a government agency dedicated to promoting sustainable aquaculture practices and fostering the growth of the aquaculture industry in the state. The primary objective of the field visit to ADAK was to provide students from the third year and first year of the Zoology department with practical exposure to aquaculture practices and the role of ADAK in the development of aquaculture in Kerala. The day began with an informative session where ADAK representatives provided an overview of the agency's mission, objectives, and its significant role in the development of aquaculture in Kerala. Students were given a guided tour of ADAK's facilities, including hatcheries, nurseries, and research labs. They had the opportunity to observe various stages of fish and shrimp farming, gaining insights into the breeding, hatching, and rearing processes. ADAK experts conducted interactive sessions where students could ask questions and engage in discussions about aquaculture practices, challenges faced by the industry, and ongoing research initiatives. The field trip included a visit to a nearby fish farm supported by ADAK. Students were able to witness real-life aquaculture practices and understand the application of ADAK's recommendations in a practical setting. Practical demonstrations were conducted to showcase modern aquaculture techniques, including water quality management, disease control measures, and the use of advanced equipment in fish and shrimp farming. The day concluded with a debriefing session, where students had the opportunity to share their observations and thoughts about the field visit. ADAK representatives provided additional information and encouraged students to consider careers in aquaculture research and development. Around 3.30 pm the flied visit tends to end. 10 students from third year and 6 students from first year are the participants.

OUTCOMES

- Students learned about ADAK's emphasis on sustainable aquaculture practices to ensure the long-term health of aquatic ecosystems and the industry.
- The field visit offered practical exposure to various stages of fish and shrimp farming, enhancing the theoretical knowledge gained in the classroom.

- Students gained awareness of the challenges faced by the aquaculture industry, such as disease management, environmental concerns, and the need for technological advancements.
- Understanding the significant role ADAK plays in supporting and promoting aquaculture in Kerala, contributing to the state's economic development

On 18th August 2023, Department of BFSI conducted field visit to Melker Financial Institution, Mala a prominent Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC) in the region. REPORT OF STUDY TOUR

The study tour to Munnar, a picturesque hill station in Kerala, was conducted on November 9th and 10th. The tour aimed to provide participants with practical exposure to the production and manufacturing aspects of the renowned facilities.

Visit to the Lokort Tea Factory at Adimaly, providing participants with insights into the tea manufacturing process. 5 students from the Department of BFSI were guided through the sprawling tea plantations surrounding the factory, learning about the cultivation, harvesting, and processing of tea leaves. The tour continued to the processing unit, where participants observed the withering, rolling, fermentation, drying, and sorting processes involved in tea production. REPORT

The primary objective of the visit was to gain practical insights into modern agricultural practices, particularly in watermelon cultivation, and to observe tissue culture techniques employed in the lab. This visit aimed to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and its practical application. The visit was divided into two parts:

1. Watermelon Field:

- o Location: Vadama
- o Duration: Morning Session
- o Focus: Watermelon cultivation techniques, pest management, irrigation systems, and post-harvest handling.

2. Tissue Culture Lab:

- o Location: Kerala Forest Research Institute, Kuzhur subcentre.
- o Duration: Afternoon Session
- o Focus: Tissue culture techniques, micropropagation, and genetic modification.

Details of the Watermelon Field Visit

The watermelon field was well-organized with rows of plants spaced adequately to ensure proper sunlight exposure and ease of management. Drip irrigation systems were installed to optimize water usage and promote uniform growth.

Varieties Observed: Different watermelon varieties were cultivated, including seedless and hybrid types. Planting Techniques: The farm used both direct seeding and transplanting methods. Transplants were grown in a nursery before being transferred to the field. Soil Management: The soil was rich in organic matter, with regular compost application to maintain fertility. Pest and Disease Management: Integrated Pest Management (IPM) strategies were employed, including the use of biological controls and minimal pesticide application.

Irrigation and Fertilization-The drip irrigation system ensured efficient water usage, reducing wastage and preventing waterlogging. Fertilization was done through fertigation, allowing nutrients to be directly delivered to the plant roots.

Harvesting and Post-Harvest Handling-Watermelons were harvested at the peak of ripeness, with workers trained to identify the right time for picking. Post-harvest handling included grading, sorting, and packing the watermelons for market distribution.

Details of the Tissue Culture Lab Visit

The lab visit began with an overview of tissue culture techniques, emphasizing their importance in plant propagation, especially for producing disease-free and genetically uniform plants. The lab was equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, including laminar flow hoods, autoclaves, and culture media preparation areas. Various stages of tissue culture were demonstrated, from explant preparation to the final stage of acclimatization.

Micropropagation Techniques-The lab showcased micropropagation techniques used for producing high-quality planting material. This included:**Callus Induction**: Demonstration of how plant tissues are induced to form callus, which can then be used for regeneration.

Shoot Multiplication: Techniques to multiply shoots from a single explant were shown, highlighting the efficiency of tissue culture in producing large numbers of plants.

Learning Outcomes

• Watermelon Field:

- o Gained a comprehensive understanding of watermelon cultivation, including modern irrigation techniques and sustainable pest management practices.
- o Observed the importance of soil health in achieving high yields and the role of post-harvest handling in maintaining product quality.

• Tissue Culture Lab:

- Learned about the intricacies of tissue culture, including the different stages of micropropagation.
- O Understood the potential of tissue culture in producing disease-free plants and its applications in genetic research.

The visit to the watermelon field and tissue culture lab on March 6, 2024, was highly educational and provided valuable insights into contemporary agricultural practices and biotechnological advancements. The hands-on experience gained from observing these practices will be instrumental in applying theoretical knowledge to real-world scenarios.

The Department of B Voc. Agriculture organized an enriching industrial visit for its faculty and students to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University on 18th January 2024, followed by an exploration of Bengaluru on 19th January 2024. The trip provided a holistic exposure to various facets of agriculture and cultural experiences.

The journey started at 5 00 am on 18th January 2024, from the college and reached Tamil Nadu Agricultural University at 9 00 AM. At Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, the participants had the privilege of visiting several key departments and units. The Insectary and Bio-control Production Units of the Entomology Department were explored, providing a hands-on experience in insect preservation and exhibition and management and biological control methods for pests.

The understanding on the housing management, care and management of young ones of cattle, care and management of pregnant and lactating animal, milking practices, *etc.*, nurtured the entrepreneur inside the students. The attached Vermicompost Unit showcased the process of converting organic waste into nutrient-rich compost using earthworms. This helped the students to think the importance of keeping their surrounding clean and thus the commitment to society.

Throughout the industrial visit, participants gained practical knowledge and exposure to diverse facets of agricultural research and production at Tamil Nadu Agricultural University.

Following their time at the university, the group embarked on an overnight journey to Bengaluru at 10 00 PM. On the next day (19th January 2024), they commenced their exploration of the city with visits to Lal Bagh and the Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum. Lal Bagh, a historic botanical garden, offered a serene environment, showcasing a diverse collection of plants and trees. The Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum provided a fascinating insight into science and technology, engaging the participants with interactive exhibits.

In the afternoon, the group visited the Garuda Shopping Mall, providing an opportunity for leisure and retail therapy. The mall, known for its diverse shopping outlets, added a modern touch to the itinerary. Later in the evening, the participants strolled through Commercial Street, a bustling shopping and entertainment district. Here, they indulged in a delightful combination of shopping and savoring local cuisine. After a dinner the participants started their return journey at 10 00 PM and reached the college on 20th January 2024 at 10 00 AM.

Outcome

The overall experience was a blend of academic enrichment, cultural exploration, and leisure, offering students and faculty a well-rounded understanding of both agricultural practices and the vibrant city life in Bengaluru.



Outcome of the programme



Study Tour of VI Semester B.A. Functional English Students to
Kottapara View Point, Ilavvezha Poonchira, Illikkal Kallu, Malankara Dam and Thommankuthu
(27-02-2024)

REPORT

On 27th February 2024, the VI Semester B.A. Functional English students embarked on a transformative study tour aimed at immersing them in the rich literary and cultural tapestry of the region. Departing from Carmel College (Autonomous), Mala, at 3:15 a.m., the students and accompanying faculty embarked on a day-long journey filled with exploration, discovery, and experiential learning.





The tour commenced with a breathtaking visit to Kottapara View Point, where students were treated to a spectacular sight: the setting moon and the rising sun gracing the horizon simultaneously. Here, amidst the tranquil beauty of nature, students engaged in critical discussions on the intersection of literature and the environment, gaining practical insights into the environmental themes prevalent in literary works. Following a hearty breakfast at 7:00 a.m., the group ventured to Illikkal Kallu, a majestic peak renowned for its geological formations and scenic beauty. Through guided discussions and literary

analysis, students explored the symbolic significance of natural landscapes in literature, deepening their understanding of environmental themes in literary texts.

After a sumptuous lunch, students and faculty moved on to the next destination — Malankara Dam. It is a gravity dam constructed across Thodupuzha river for irrigation purposes. The dam is constructed to make use of the tail water from the Moolamattom Power House. The project is run under the Muvattupuzha Valley Irrigation Project and KSEB. The artificial lake covers an area of around 11 square km. Here, the students discussed about the role of water bodies in literature and culture, fostering an appreciation for the cultural significance of natural landmarks. At Ilavvezha Poonchira, students delved into the cultural heritage of the region, examining the literary motifs and cultural symbols prevalent in local folklore and traditions. As the day progressed, the group visited Thommankuthu waterfall, engaging in critical analysis of literary works inspired by natural landscapes. Here, amidst the cascading waters and lush greenery, students reflected on the evocative power of nature in literature, honing their skills in literary interpretation and analysis.

After supper, students had the opportunity to unwind and immerse themselves in the world of cinema as part of their Film Studies Core Course by watching the recent blockbuster rom-com Malayalam movie *Premalu* at Ashirvad Theatre, Perumbavoor. This film, a poignant portrayal of young adulthood, delves into the challenges and adventures faced by young adults as they navigate their first jobs or strive to secure employment. It captures the essence of newfound independence, portraying the struggles, aspirations, and triumphs of individuals venturing into the professional world away from the comforts of home. The participants reached Mala by 1.00 am.



The Department of English collaborated with Annamanada Grama Panchayat for the "Spark of English" Programme under the Vijayabheri Project (English Communication Skills Training Programme) as part of the Department's Extension Activity. The specific focus of the activity was on enhancing the English communication skills and learning experience for slow learners of V STD in two schools under Annamanada Grama Panchayat: Government Samithy Higher Secondary School, Meladoor, and Government U.P. School, Annamanada. The list of slow learners of V STD who were the target group for the extension activity was shared from the end of the aforementioned schools to the Annamanada Grama Panchayat. The extension activity spanned 15 days, from January 4, 2024, to January 24, 2024. 8 students from I B.A. Functional English and 20 students from II B.A. Functional English served as resource persons for the extension activity. These 28 students were divided into three groups, each comprising one core and two peer teams. While Group I, led by Ms. Lakshmi Priya, II B.A. Functional English catered to slow learners of Government U.P. School, Annamanada, Groups 2 and 3, led by Ms. Gouri Vinod and Ms. Hannath Habeeb of II B.A. Functional English, respectively, took English communication training classes for the 2 batches of slow learners from Government Samithy Higher Secondary School, Meladoor. Ms. Linda. P. Joseph, Assistant Professor, coordinated the extension activity. Dr. Pretty John P., Head of the Department of English, Carmel College (Autonomous), Mala developed the syllabus and question paper for the final evaluation of V STD students. Dr. Pretty John P., Ms. Keerthy Sophiya Ponnachan, Ms. Linda P. Joseph, Ms. Sifna Xavier, and Ms. Annliya Shaijan served as student-teacher trainers of the "Spark of English" Programme. An assessment test was conducted on January 24, 2024, to gauge the progress made by each slow learner. The faculty of the

department promptly evaluated the answer scripts, and a comprehensive summary of the results was expeditiously provided to both the Panchayat and the beneficiary schools. Written feedback was gathered from the students of the schools to evaluate the effectiveness of the communication skills training given by the students of the department and to implement necessary reforms and improvements as deemed necessary.

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




