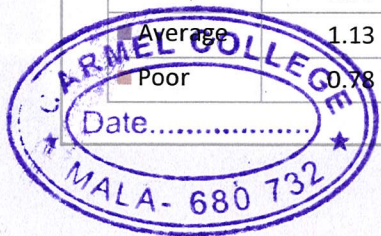
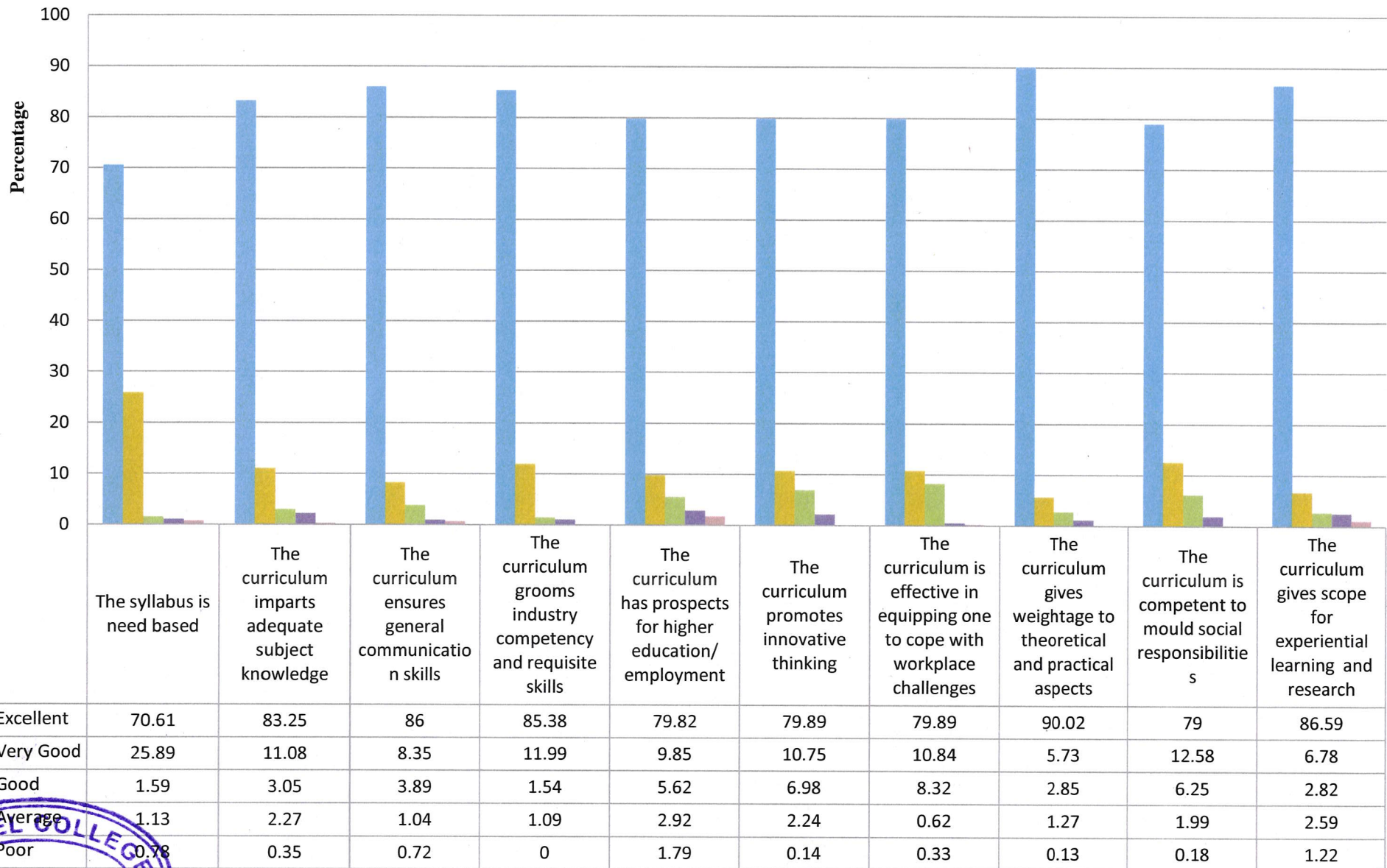


## Employers' Feedback on Curriculum 2015-2016

## Employers' Feedback Analysis

2015-2016

Carmel College is proud to say that the college has a very strong employee sector for firms. The college conducted a satisfaction survey of employers regarding the curriculum that is undergone by our alumnae, who works as their employees, during their course of study.

Around 70% of the respondents have opined that the syllabus of the course studied by their employees is need-based. Employers have a very good impression on the basic subject knowledge of the employee. Majority of respondents' opinion about the general communication skills of their employees falls into the category of either very good or excellent. 85.39% of respondents agree that the curriculum has groomed industry competency and requisite skills in their employees. About 79.82% of employers have found the prospects of the curriculum in promoting higher education and employment as excellent while 1.79% of them disagrees with this opinion in the survey. The parameter on the efficiency of the curriculum in promoting innovative thinking has been rated as excellent by 79.89% of the respondents. 79.89% of the employers consider the curriculum is effective in equipping one to cope with workplace challenges. 86.59% of employers have shared utmost satisfaction with the scope of curriculum in providing experiential learning and research. About 90.02% of the respondents have expressed their highest level of satisfaction regarding the scope of the curriculum in giving balanced weightage to both the theoretical and practical aspects. The respondents have shared a very good opinion regarding the competency of the curriculum to mould social responsibilities in students.



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
