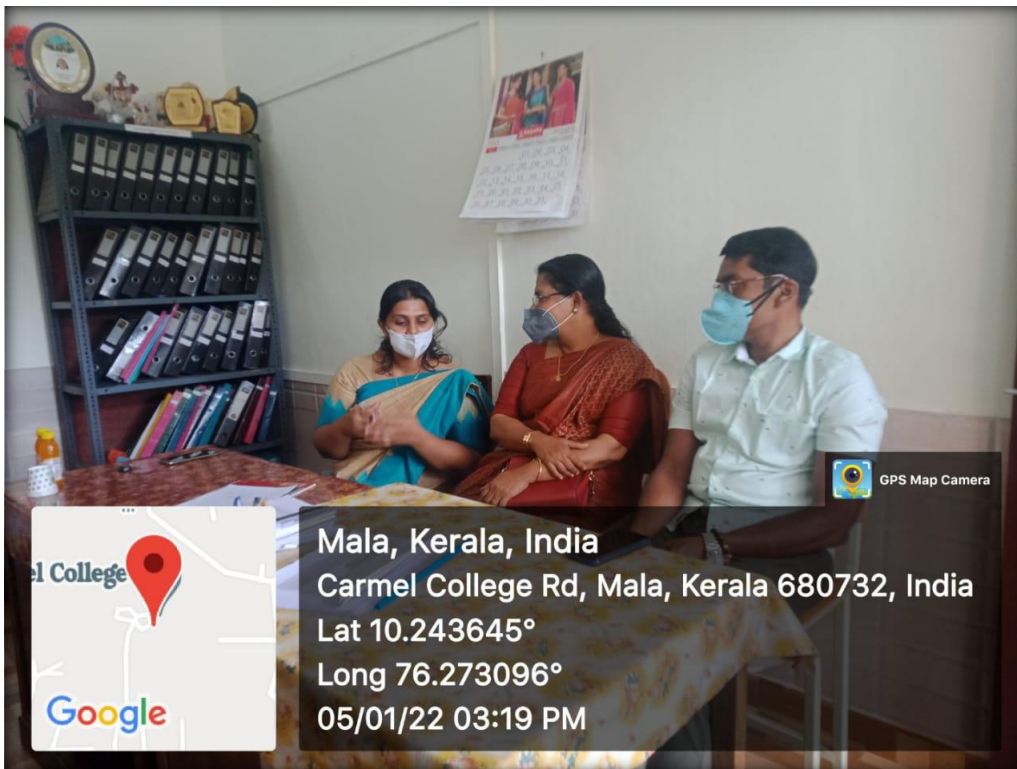

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



The College conducted the Academic Audit for the year 2020-21 with the aim of evaluating and assessing the qualitative performance of the various departments and measuring the extent of their contribution in the progress of the students and the institution. The IQAC was instrumental in the constitution of an external expert panel for the conduct of the Audit. The experts conducted a detailed assessment of the Self-Study Reports submitted by the departments. The team was very appreciative of the initiatives, measures and strategies employed by the departments in delivering their best. Some of the noteworthy suggestions put forward by the expert committee members are the following:-

- Since the college caters to a diverse section of students, introduction of new Add-on courses and certificate courses would be very encouraging.
- The programmes such as B.B.A, B.Com and B.C.A were identified as potential crowd-pullers and collaborations and more internships and projects were sure to contribute to the same extensively.



- The team was of the opinion that some of the departments had the potential to extend consultancy services in the neighbourhood and also be instrumental in conducting extension activities.
- The experts also suggested increase in the number of MoUs with industrial partners and other possible employers.
- The economically backward students could be assisted by lending them books through a system of book bank.
- Faculty members are to be encouraged to enrol for Ph.D.
- Faculty members to be also motivated to apply for more funded projects and improve their research acumen.
- The number of Research publications per faculty needs to be improved.
- The college in union with external placement partners needs to organise more placement drives in order to provide opportunities to the students to prepare themselves for the employment market.
- Some of the curriculum related and career guidance programmes could be implemented with the help of alumnae members.
