Carmel College, managed by CMC Udaya Educational Society, is committed to empowering women ever since its establishment in 1981. Reaccredited with an 'A' grade by NAAC in the third cycle, Carmel College is one of the leading institutions in the University of Calicut.

The college offers **18** UG courses including 5 B. Voc courses, **8** PG courses and 2 Diploma Courses offered by Community College with a student strength of **1500**. The Department of Vocational Studies has been upgraded with three new courses: Fashion Technology, Accounting and Taxation and Banking Financial Services and Insurance and also Banking and Tally in the Community College Division of our College. Besides, Add-on Courses and Certificate Courses under UGC Schemes and diverse Computer Courses offered by C-DIT and ICES, a Certificate Course in Value Education affiliated to the Christian Chair under Calicut University is also offered. Moreover, there are a variety of clubs and forums to complement academic and non-academic activities.

The academic year 2018-19 has brighter memorable moments too. Some years ago, a research centre for Carmel College was only a dream and it has been realized. The Department of Botany has been upgraded to the Research Department by the University of Calicut on 31st July 2018 with research guides Dr. Sr. Kochuthressia K.P., Dr. Sr. Sinjumol Thomas and Dr. Bindhu K. B.

LIBRARY

The library has a collection of 30,074 books, 94 periodicals/journals, 1552 back volumes and 614 CDs. Smt. Thankamani, Kerala Sangeetha Nataka Academy Award Winner inaugurated the Reading Week and Library Club. It has given an orientation on the library etiquette to all the students and staff and a seminar for faculty on "E-Resources" by Sr. Jisna, Librarian, Vimala College, Thrissur. The Department of English in collaboration with the library organized a "Book Fair" by Cosmo Books, Thrissur as part of the *LitArena* 2k19, Inter-collegiate Fest. The Department of English also organized a workshop on “Creative Narrative” in honour of the retiring Librarian Sr. Mary I.K and donated Shashi Tharoor’s *The Paradoxical Prime Minister Narendra Modi* to the library. FINE ARTS

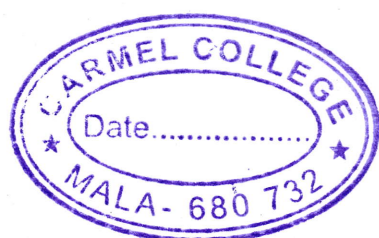

AICUF and Jesus Youth collected clothes for the flood victims of Kuttanadu and Alapuzha. The faculty of departments visited the flood-affected homes of the students to extend all possible aids as material supplies, financial assistance and mental support. MA History students' contribution of Rs.10,000 and the Department of Political Science's contribution of Rs. 1,40,000 for the construction of a flood-affected student are to be specially mentioned.
