## **FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES**

### **The Constitution of India**

#### **Article 51-A**

#### **It shall be the duty of every citizen of India**

3. To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;

## COURSES

The Under Graduate Programmes are offered under Choice Based Credit Semester System. The Duration of the Programme is 6 semesters, distributed in a period of 3 years. The odd semester will start in June and will end up in October and even semester will start in November and will end up in March. Each semester will have a minimum of 90 working days. For passing the degree programme, a student should have to achieve a minimum of 120 credits in three years of study.

The Under Graduate Programmes includes 6 types of courses:

### **A. Common Courses:**

English and Languages (Malayalam / Hindi)

### **B. Core Courses:**

All students should complete 10 to 18 core courses of 50 credits, which belong to the main subject, during their degree programme.

### **C. Complementary Courses:**

All students should complete 24 credits of one or two disciplines, which are related to the core subject, during their degree.

### **D. Open Courses:**

All students should study a course other than the core subjects during the 5<sup>th</sup> semester, which will have a weightage of 4 credits.

### **E. Elective Courses:**

All students should study one elective course along with the core subjects during the sixth semester, which will have a weightage of 2/3 credits.

### **F. Audit Course/ Ability Enhancement Course:**

All Students should study this course as per the directions from the regulatory authorities like U.G.C., Supreme Court etc.

### EVALUATION AND GRADING FOR U.G. PROGRAMME

Mark system is followed instead of direct grading for each question. For each course in the semester, letter grade and grade point are introduced in the 10- point indirect grading system.

#### Course Evaluation

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts:

1. Internal Assessment. 2. External Evaluation. 20% weightage shall be given to the internal assessment. The remaining 80% shall be for the external evaluation.

#### 1. Internal Assessment

20% of the total marks in each course are for internal examinations. The marks secured for the internal assessment are need to be submitted to the Controller of Examinations office / sent to University by the colleges concerned.

The internal assessment shall be based on a pre-determined transparent system involving written tests, class room participation based on attendance in respect of theory courses and lab involvement / record submission based on punctuality and attendance in respect of



practical courses.

The Internal assessment of the project will be based on its content, method of presentation, conclusion and orientation to research aptitude.

### For practical courses

To ensure the transparency of the evaluation process, the internal assessment marks awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be notified on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of external examination. There shall not be any chance for the improvement of internal marks.

The course teacher(s) shall maintain the academic record of each student registered for the course, which shall be forwarded to the University by the college Principal / CoE office by the Head of the Department after obtaining the signatures of students, course teacher and the course teacher and Head of the Department

## 2. External Evaluation

External evaluation carries 80% marks. All question papers of III U. G. Programmes shall be set by the University. Question papers of Autonomous Batches are generated from the question bank. The external question papers may be of uniform pattern with 80/60 marks (The annexure can be given as Question paper pattern). The courses with 2/3 credits will have an external examination of 2 hours duration with 60 marks and courses with 4/5 credits will have an external examination of 2.5 hours duration with 80 marks.

The external examination in theory courses of III U. G. Programmes is to be conducted by the University; for Autonomous Batches with questions generated from the question bank. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done by examiners based on a well- defined scheme of valuation and answer keys shall be provided by the chief examiners of the respective course.

The external examination in practical courses shall be conducted by two examiners- one internal and an external, the latter appointed by the University / CoE office.

The project evaluation with viva can be conducted either internal or external which may be decided by the Board of Studies concerned. After the external evaluation, only marks are to be entered in the answer scripts. All other calculations including grading are done by the University / CoE office.



Revaluation: In the new system of grading, revaluation is permissible. The prevailing rules of revaluation are applicable to C.B.C.S.S.U.G. 2019.

Students can apply for photocopies of answer scripts of external examinations. Applications for photocopies/ scrutiny/ revaluation should be submitted within 10 days of publication of results. The fee for this shall be as decided by the University/CoE office.

### **Indirect Grading System**

Indirect Grading System is based on a 10- Point Scale is used to evaluate the performance of students.

Each course is evaluated by assigning marks with a letter grade (O, A<sup>+</sup>, A, B<sup>+</sup>, B, C, P, F, I or Ab. ) to that course by the method of indirect grading.

An aggregate of P grade (after external and internal put together) is required in each course for a pass and also for awarding a degree (A minimum of 20% marks in external evaluation is needed for a pass in a course. But no separate pass minimum is needed for internal evaluation).

No separate grade/mark for internal and external will be displayed in the grade card ; only an aggregate grade will be displayed. Also the aggregate mark of internal and external is not displayed in the grade card.

A student who fails to secure a minimum grade for a pass in a course is permitted to write the examination along with the next batch. However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of S.G.P.A. obtained.

S.G.P.A. of the student in that semester is calculated using the formula

$$\text{S.G.P.A.} = \frac{\text{Sum of the credit points of all courses in a Semester}}{\text{Total credits in that semester}}$$

The cumulative Grade Point Average (C.G.P.A.) of the student is calculated at the end of a programme.

The C.G.P.A. of a student determines the overall academic



level of the student in a programme and is the criterion for ranking the students. CGPA can be calculated by the following formula.

$$\text{C.G.P.A.} = \frac{\text{Total credits points obtained in six semesters}}{\text{Total credits acquired (120)}}$$

S.G.P.A. and C.G.P.A. shall be rounded off to three decimal places. C.G.P.A. determines broad academic level of the student in a programme and is the index for ranking students (in terms of grade points).

An overall letter grade (cumulative grade) for the entire programme shall be awarded to a student depending on her/his C.G.P.A. (Annexure- I)

### **Ability Enhancement Courses/Audit Courses**

There are courses which are mandatory for a programme but not counted for the calculation of S.G.P.A. or C.G.P.A. There shall be one Audit course each in the first four semesters. These courses are not meant for class room study. The students can attain only pass (Grade P) for these courses. At the end of each semester there shall be examination conducted by the college from a pool of questions (Question Bank) set by the University. The students can also attain these credits through online courses like SWAYAM, MOOC and so on(optional). The list of passed students must be sent to the University from the colleges / to the CoE office at least before the fifth semester examination. The lists of courses in each semester with credits are given below:

- **Question Paper Type 1**

Scheme of Examinations: The Question Paper for the external examination is set for 80 marks and the internal examination is of 20 marks. Duration of each external Examination is 2.5 Hrs. The pattern of External Examination is as given below. The students can answer all the questions in Sections A&B. But there shall be Ceiling in each section.

Section A:-

Short Answer type carries 2 marks each - 15 questions      Ceiling - 25

Section B:-

Paragraph/ Problem type carries 5 marks each-8 questions      Ceiling-35

Section C:-

Essay type carries 10 marks (2 out of 4)      2X10=20

- **Question Paper Type 2**

Scheme of Examinations: The Question Paper for the external examination is set for 60 marks and the internal examination is of 15 marks. Duration of each external Examination is 2 Hrs. The pattern of External Examination is as given below. The students can answer all the questions in Sections A & B. But there shall be Ceiling in each section.

Section A:-

Short Answer type carries 2 marks each - 12 questions -      Ceiling - 20

Section B:-

Paragraph/ Problem type carries 5 marks each - 7 questions - Ceiling - 30

Section C:-

Essay type carries 10 marks (1 out of 2)      1X10=10

### Calicut University Social Service Programme (C.U.S.S.P.)

In this programme, a student has to complete 12 days of social service. This has to be completed in the first four semesters; 3 days in each semester. For the regular programme, the student has to work in a Panchayath/ Local body or in a hospital/ poor home/ old age home/ Pain and Palliative centre or any social work assigned by the College authorities. The students who are involved in College Union activities and those who participate in sports and cultural activities in the Zonal level have to undergo only 6 days of C.U.S.S.P. during the entire programme.



All documents regarding the student participation should be kept in the college and the Principal should give a Certificate for the same. The list of students (successfully completed the programme) must be sent to the University / CoE office before the commencement of the fifth semester examinations. A College level Coordinator and a Department level Coordinator shall be appointed for the smooth conduct of the programme.

### **EVALUATION AND GRADING FOR P.G. PROGRAMME**

#### **Internal Evaluation / Continuous Assessment (C.A.)**

This assessment shall be based on a predetermined transparent system involving periodic written tests, assignments, seminars and Viva-Voce in respect of theory courses and based on tests, lab skill and records/viva in respect of practical courses.

Grades given for the internal evaluation are based on the grades A+, A, B, C, D and E with GRADE POINTS 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 and 0 respectively. The overall grades shall be as per the Ten Point Scale

There shall be no separate minimum Grade Point for internal evaluation. To ensure transparency of the evaluation process, the internal assessment marks awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be published on the notice board before 5 days of commencement of external examination.

There shall not be any chance for the improvement of internal marks.



The course teacher shall maintain academic record of each student registered for the course, which shall be forwarded to the, Office of Controller of Examinations after being endorsed by the Head of the Department.

For each course There shall be class test/s for each course in a semester. Grades should be displayed on the notice board. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal.

Each student shall be required to do assignment/s for each course. Assignments after valuation must be returned to the students.

The teacher shall define the expected quality of the above in terms of structure, content, presentation and so on and inform the same to the students. Punctuality in submissions is to be considered.

Every student shall deliver Seminar / Presentation as an internal component for every course and must be evaluated by the respective course teacher in terms of structure, content, presentation and interaction. The soft and hard copies of the seminar report are to be submitted to the course teacher.

All the records of Continuous Assessment (C.A.) must be kept in the college and must be made available for verification by CoE office, if asked for.

### **External /End Semester Evaluation (E.S.E.)**

- The semester- end examinations in theory courses shall be conducted by the CoE office with question papers generated from question bank. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done by examiners based on a well- defined scheme of valuation.
- After the external evaluation, only Grades are to be entered in the space provided in the answer script for individual questions and calculations need to be done only up to the cumulative Grade Point (C.G.P.) and all other calculations including grades are to be done by the CoE office.
- Students shall have the right to apply for revaluation or scrutiny as per rules within the time permitted for it.



- Photocopies of the answer scripts of the external examination shall be made available to the students for scrutiny on request by them as per rules.
- The external evaluation shall be done immediately after the examination preferably in a centralized valuation camp.
- The language of writing the examination shall be in accordance with the separate regulations for the programme by the concerned Board of Studies.

### **Question Paper Pattern**

Questions shall be set to assess the knowledge acquired, standard, and application of knowledge, application of knowledge in new situations, critical evaluation of knowledge and the ability to synthesize knowledge. Due Weightage shall be given to each module based on content/teaching hours allotted to each module.

- It has to be ensured that questions covering all skills are included in the question paper.



- The question paper shall be a judicious mix of short answer type, short essay type/problem solving type and long essay type questions.
- The question shall be prepared in such a way that the answers can be awarded A+, A, B, C, D and E Grades.
- Weightage: Different types of questions shall be given different weightages to quantify their range given in the following model:

5. Questions should be asked as possible from all modules following a uniform distribution. However concerned BoS can change the pattern and type of question subject to the condition that total Weightage should be 30.
- End Semester evaluation in practical courses shall be conducted and evaluated by both Internal and External Examiners as per the stipulations of the concerned Board of Studies. Duration and other aspects of practical external examinations shall be decided by the Boards of Studies concerned.





**Audit Courses**

In addition to the above courses, there will be two Audit Courses (Ability Enhancement Course and Professional Competency Course) with 4 credits each. These have to be done one each in the first two semesters. The credits will not be counted for evaluating the overall S.G.P.A. and C.G.P.A.

The colleges shall conduct examination for these courses and have to intimate/upload the results of the same to the Websites on the stipulated date during the III semester. Students have to obtain only minimum pass requirements in the Audit Courses.

## PROCEDURES

### GENERAL RULES

Education, in its true sense, should comprise, besides the acquisition of knowledge, the formation of an ideal character by bringing body, mind and heart under discipline and by developing everything that is good and beautiful in human nature. Hence it should be the earnest endeavour of every student. The students should be gentle and refined in manners and modest in dress and comportment. The students' registration in the college is considered as an expression of willingness to abide by all rules and regulations prevailing in the college.

Every student, therefore, is committed to the observance of these rules.

1. Rules of modesty and decorum in dress should be strictly adhered to. A simple chain, a pair of earrings and a wrist watch may be worn. The students shall wear uniforms according to the directions given by the college authorities.
2. It is the responsibility of the students to treat college property with care. They should help to keep the buildings and campus neat and clean. Any damage done by a student to the property of the college or of the other must be compensated either by repair or by replacement. Besides, if the situation warrants, the offenders will be subjected to other disciplinary measures.
3. Students shall endeavour to preserve cleanliness and orderliness in the classrooms, verandahs and college premises. Dislocating chairs and other furniture, dirtying the surroundings by throwing bits of paper, and sprinkling ink on the floor, walls and furniture are not in keeping with the high sense of order and cleanliness. Congregating at the entrance of the college gate, sitting on the steps at the portico and sitting on the parapets create a bad impression and, therefore, are to be avoided.
4. Books, stationery and umbrella should bear the name of the owner. The college will not be responsible for any loss of money or article incurred by the students through their carelessness.





They are likewise forbidden to borrow or lend money or article.

5. No magazine, newspaper, mobile phone or Walkman is allowed to be brought to the college or hostel without the permission of the Principal. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited during class hours.
6. Strict silence should be observed at all times in the reading room and library and in the classroom during class hours.
7. Attendance and active participation in all activities organized by the college is compulsory.
8. No student should be seen in verandah during the class hours.
9. Irregular attendance, insubordination of lectures, habitual inattention to class work, obscenity in word or deed are sufficient reasons for the permanent or temporary dismissal of the student. Minor offences are punishable by fines, loss of attendance etc.
10. No subscription of any kind is allowed without the previous permission of the Principal.
11. Official letters addressed to college authorities should enclose reply postage.
12. Students are not allowed to make complaints in a body or present any collective petition.
13. No notice should be pasted on the notice board without the permission of the Principal. Important notices will be posted on the respective notice boards. It is the responsibility of the students to read these notices and to respond immediately if summoned through them. Students should read the notice put up on the notice board carefully every day morning when they come and in the evening when they leave. All administrative, departmental and activity bulletin boards are for official use only. To tamper with them is a serious offence.
14. The college does not charge any capitation fees nor does it accept



any donation as a consideration for admission / appointment.

15. Loss of working days due to unforeseen circumstances will be made up by classes on Saturdays.
16. Students in the campus should wear their identity cards and it must be produced for all transactions in the college.
17. Generally, no certificate will be issued in less than 48 hours' notice.
18. Fees once paid are non refundable.
19. Any student may be suspended, dismissed or expelled from the college at any time during the year for the following offences:
  - a. Stealing
  - b. Any form of cheating
  - c. Any form of public immorality in campus or during a college function
  - d. Possessing or bringing into campus pornographic materials
  - e. Bringing alcohol or any intoxicating beverages into the campus. Coming into the campus under the influence of alcohol or prohibited drugs and misbehaving
  - f. Bringing or carrying within the campus fire arms or any lethal weapon.
  - g. Physical assault on others.
  - h. Gross and deliberate discourtesy to college personnel or students on or off the campus.
  - i. Possession or use or trafficking of drugs on the campus.
  - j. Vandalism in campus or of any college property.
  - k. Gambling on campus.
  - l. Tampering with and / or falsification of school or public documents.



- m. Preventing or threatening students or college staff or authorities from discharging their duties or from attending classes or from entering the college premises.
- 20. Study tour may be arranged for the final year students (III D.C. and II P.G.) for two days with the consent of the class teacher and head of the department and prior approval of the Principal. Students will not be allowed to go on tour unless they are accompanied by a member of the teaching staff.
- 21. Students are free to meet, write to and talk to the Principal individually about issues related to them or the college administration. But they may not make any complaint in a body or through a collective petition.
- 22. Students may not organize programmes for collecting funds nor may they make any kind of fund- collection in the campus, without the explicit prior permission of the principal.



## **CODE OF CONDUCT AND ETHICS**

## **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE STUDENTS**

Education, in its true sense, should comprise, besides the acquisition of knowledge, the formation of an ideal character by bringing body, mind and heart under discipline and by developing every thing that is ethical and enduring in human nature. Emphasizing this conviction, the institution entrusts its students to be committed to the observance of the



rules and regulations prevailing in the college.

The student's enrollment in the college is considered as an expression of will-ingness to abide by these rules.

1. Every student is mandated to adhere to the college timing for class hours which is from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Students may engage in other curricular or extra –curricular pursuits from 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.
2. Students should endeavor to preserve an atmosphere of learning in the campus and not indulge in activities that hinder the discipline in the campus.
3. Attendance and active participation in all activities organized for students by the college is obligatory.
4. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each class by respective teachers. Late-comers may be refused attendance, except in cases of valid reason.
5. Students requiring leave for a particular period may seek permission from the teacher concerned.
6. Application for leave, collected from college office, should be duly submitted to the office by the student upon countersign by parent/guardian and class tutor.
7. A student absenting from the college for more than 5 consecutive days should report to the Principal upon return, before entering class.
8. Students are required to attend the internal examinations and the timely conduct of other academic requirements such as assignments, seminars, viva, practical etc. without fail..
9. Students are mandated to secure a minimum of 75% average attendance for all the courses to register for the end semester examination. For those failing to meet the requirement on valid grounds will be granted permission by the University to attend the examination on payment of condonation fee.
10. Sports students representing college or university in various tournaments may be granted attendance on submission of leave application duly recommended by competent authority. N.C.C.



cadets, N.S.S. volunteers and students attending University College Union co-curricular activities are also eligible to avail such leave.

11. Irregular attendance, defiance, habitual inattention to class, obscenity in word or deed are sufficient reasons for the permanent or temporary dismissal of a student.
12. Students while in the campus should wear their identity cards and it must be produced for all transactions in the college.
13. Students should comply with the rules of modesty and decorum in attire. The students shall wear uniforms according to the directions given by the college authorities.
14. It is the responsibility of the students to treat college property with care. They should partake in keeping the buildings and campus neat and clean.
15. Students shall endeavor to preserve dignity, discipline and orderliness in the classrooms, library, verandahs, and college premises.
16. The college will not be responsible for any loss of money or article incurred by the students through their carelessness. They are likewise forbidden to borrow or lend money or article.
17. Mobile phones, cameras and other electronic gadgets are prohibited in the campus. Bringing or circulating unenlightening magazines, newspapers, pamphlets etc. within the college or hostel premises are advised against.
18. In case of grievances of any forms, students may approach their respective class tutor or Head of the department. The service of Students Grievance Redressal Cell in the college can also be availed by the students.
19. Students are free to meet, write and talk to the Principal individually about issues pertaining to them or the college administration. However, students are required to maintain the etiquette while raising/filing a grievance.
20. No notice should be pasted on the notice board without the permission of the Principal. All administrative, departmental, and activity bulletin boards are for official use only. To tamper with them is a serious offence.



21. The college does not charge any capitation fees nor does it accept any donation as a consideration for admission/appointment.
22. Any student may be suspended, dismissed, or expelled from the college at any time during the year for the following offences:
  - I) Stealing
  - II) Any form of cheating or dishonesty
  - III) Any form of public immorality in campus or during a college function
  - IV) Possessing or bringing into campus pornographic materials
  - V) Bringing alcoholic or any intoxicating beverages into campus. Coming into the campus under the influence of alcohol or prohibited drugs and misbehaving
  - VI) Bringing or carrying within the campus firearms or any lethal weapon
  - VII) Physical assault on others
  - VIII) Gross and deliberate discourtesy to college personnel or students on or off the campus
  - IX) Possession, use or trafficking of drugs on the campus.
  - X) Vandalism in campus or on college property.
  - XI) Gambling
  - XII) Tampering with and/or falsification of school or public documents
  - XIII) Preventing or threatening students or college staff or authorities from discharging their duties or from attending classes or from entering the college premises.
23. Students shall not organize programs with the intent to collect funds in the campus, without the explicit prior permission of the Principal.
24. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus.



## WARNING AGAINST RAGGING

Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Ragging means doing any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution that causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes:

- Teasing, abusing, or playing jokes on, or hurting a student
- Asking a student to do any act or perform something which the student is unwilling to do

If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student will be given liberty to explain, and if her explanation is unsatisfactory, the student will be expelled from the institution.

Any written complaint obtained regarding ragging will also be forwarded to the police authorities. The college will not be responsible for the criminal proceedings initiated in this regard.

## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE PARENTS/ GUARDIANS

1. Parent/Guardian entails to the person identified in the official register of the college at the time of the enrollment of student and shall therefore be present at the college on events corresponded to do so.
2. Being an irreplaceable stakeholder of the institution, parents/guardians are expected to uphold the vision, mission and practices of the college and contribute to the upliftment of the institution.
3. Parents/guardians are expected to actively partake in general P.T.A. and class P.T.A. and ensure cordial communication with the tutors regarding the conduct and overall performance of their child/ward.
4. Parents have the right to raise concerns or issues related to the education of their child and seek clarification/aid through proper channel and with right person.
5. Any sort of suggestions or grievances pertaining to the conduct of the college may be posited directly to the concerned authority either individually or through approved bodies such as P.T.A.





6. Parents/guardians should inform the respective class tutors when their child/ward is on leave.
7. Parents/guardians are required to come in person, in cases of emergencies or necessities, which require the student to leave college before 3:30 p.m. They may consult the Head of the department to get sanction for the students to leave college premise.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE TEACHERS**

1. Teachers should effuse courtesy, professionalism, and impartiality in their dealings with students, parents/guardians, colleagues and other staff of the institution.
2. . Teachers must report for duty on time and remain in the campus during the working hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
3. All academic and administrative duties assigned may be undertaken and performed in the best possible manner.
4. Teachers may leave the campus only with the approval of the Principal during their working hours.
5. Consistent attempts should be made for professional growth through learning and research.
6. Teachers should actively engage in academic bodies at various levels, and contribute to framing and implementing ideal practices and policies so as to assure a more congenial academic environment in the institution.
7. They should refrain from engaging in activities that promote hatred or enmity and positively ensure a culture that fosters cooperation between colleagues.
8. Teachers should keep themselves updated in their discipline in order to guide the students to thrive academically and should be accessible to them as much as possible.
9. Class tutors and mentors should ensure the wholesome well-being of the students, entrusted to them and should be in reach for them whenever required.



10. Teachers should extend the benefits of their knowledge and vocation for the betterment of the community at large through collaborations, extension/outreach initiatives.
11. Teachers should be torch bearers of inclusive outlook and promote the ideals of ethical behavior, gender equity, democracy and secularism.
12. Teachers shall groom the students to exercise tolerance, stimulate their spirit of inquiry, and help them to get moulded into better individuals and social beings.
13. They should perform citizenship responsibilities and encourage students' participation in social service operations.
14. They should earnestly work for organizing awareness classes and workshops by experts for students to hone their cognition, skills and resilience.
15. They should extend their guidance and support for the activities conducted for and by students and to encourage them to balance their participation in academic and co-curricular activities.
16. Under no circumstances should the students be exploited for the personal interest of the faculty.
17. They may direct grievances of any manner to the concerned authority or Staff Grievance Redressal Cell.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF**

1. Administrative staff should imbibe themselves into the policies and procedures of the college, and should be prepared to implement them.
2. They must report for duty on time and remain in the campus during the working hours which is from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
3. They should give essential support, training and time to the faculties and support staffs who agree to accept assignments currently outside their qualifications and skills but accepted to perform these assignments within their expected potential.



4. They should ensure that the work assigned to an employee meets the terms of the employee's job description and the collective agreements and that the duties are appropriate to the qualifications and skills of the employee.
5. They should ensure that all expenditures fall within budget and fair bidding practices are observed.
6. They should maintain college funds and practice fiscal responsibility.
7. They should stay true to the custodianship of the files and documents entrusted to them and maintain confidentiality of the same.
8. They should maintain co-operative and collegial relationships with the other staffs and students of the institution.
9. The administrative staff should extend timely support to the students, faculty and support staff with the resources needed to effectually carry out their jobs.
10. Complaints regarding the functioning of any section may be directly communicated to the Superintendent or submitted to Non-Teaching Staff Grievance Redressal Cell.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE SUPPORT STAFF**

1. The support staff has to familiarise with the college policies to make themselves fit to their best ability.
2. They must report for duty on time and remain in the campus during the working hours which is from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
3. They have to be professional and committed in performing the duties assigned to them with diligence and sincerity.
4. The support staff should not undertake any other job within the stipulated office hours.
5. The support staff is restricted from engaging themselves in political or anti-secular activities which may affect the functioning of the college.
6. They should remain respectful and refrain from engaging in remarks or behavior that might be considered impudent to their non-teaching colleagues, teaching staff or students.



**CODE OF ETHICS TO CHECK MALPRACTICES AND PLAGIARISM**

1. Plagiarism should be avoided by paraphrasing, citing, quoting, and referencing the original work.
2. Plagiarism software shall be used to ensure that documents such as thesis, dissertation, term papers, reports, publications, or any other such documents are free of plagiarism.
3. While submitting a thesis, dissertation, technical papers, or any other such documents to the supervisor/guide, every student should submit an undertaking indicating that the document is his/her bonafide work and free of any plagiarism.
4. Every faculty- researcher submitting a thesis, dissertation, technical papers or any other such documents to the Board of Anti-Plagiarism shall submit an undertaking indicating that the document has been prepared by him or her.
5. The undertaking shall include the fact that the document has been duly checked through a plagiarism detection tool approved by the institution.
6. Each supervisor/guide shall submit a certificate indicating that the work done by the researcher under him/her is plagiarism-free.

### 3. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. The working days are divided into two sessions into periods of one hour.
2. The first bell for class is given 10 minutes before the commencement of the morning and afternoon session and the second bell at the hour fixed for the commencement of the class.
3. At the first bell for the morning session, all students shall go to their class's morning payer.
4. Late comers should enter the class with the permission of the Professor /Lecturer in charge of that class.
5. Daily attendance and hourly attendance will be taken by staff.
6. No student is allowed to leave class room without the permission of the Lecturer in charge or until the class is dismissed.
7. If a student wants to leave the college during class hours either their parent or guardian should come and get the permission from the Principal.
8. Office provides leave books on payment of Rs. 5/-. Application for leave must be recommended by the tutor- in charge. In case of unforeseen circumstances, the application for leave must be submitted on very first day of students' return to the college.
9. The students who absent herself for a day without leave loses two days attendance. Absence without leave will be penalized at the discretion of the Principal.
10. Absence without leave from examination and on the day of the reopening of the classes after holidays Will be dealt seriously. In case of illness, a Medical Certificate should be produced. No re-examination will be conducted for the students who are absent during class tests and terminal examinations.

Students who were absent will lose the marks allotted for the particular exam. Their performance in other tests and examination will be the basis for their promotion or failure.



11. A student requiring leave only for the particular hour may be granted such leave by the lecturer in charge.
12. Those who absent themselves without leave or those whose application for leave has been sanctioned for any reason will have to pay a fine of Rs. 1.00 per day. The fines should be paid along with the leave slip.

**Library Rules**

1. As the Library is a place of individual study, students should conduct themselves inside the Library as to maintain an atmosphere conducive to this. Strict silence must be observed in the Library, reading room and its immediate premises.
2. Books and other personal belongings should not be taken into the Library. However each student may take papers with her.
3. The Library will be kept open from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm.
4. Students without the identity card may not enter the Library.
5. The Library follows open access system.
6. The time schedule for different sections in the Library as follows:-

8. If a book is not returned on the due date the student will be charged Rs.1/- per day (Holiday inclusive) per book as fine.

Library catalogues are available for reference at the counter, internet browsing, circulation online public access catalogue (OPAC) and computerized searching facility for library holdings are available.

10. It is the duty of the borrowers to take maximum care of the library books issued to them. Please help us to keep the book fresh and clean. Dog-earing the pages of a book marking or writing therein with ink or pencil, tearing out of its pages, and spoiling of binding will constitute an damage to a book. Any such damage to a book is a serious offence. Unless the borrower points out the damage at the time of borrowing the books, she shall be required to replace the book or pay the price of the latest edition of the book including postage. It is left to the discretion of the authorities to press for a heavier penalty.
11. For loss of books the following procedure will be followed:-
- 1. If new edition or copies of the lost books are available with



the suppliers the book has to be replaced by a new one.

2. If the lost book is not available for replacement the value of the lost book will be realized at the following rates:-
  - a. Thrice the face value of the book which are published prior to 1944
  - b. If the book value cannot be ascertained from the Library Stock Registers, compensation will be fixed on the basis of the market price of similar publication at the time of fixation.
12. Current periodicals, reference books, rare and out of print books will not be issued to be taken outside the Library.
13. P. G. Students are permitted to take 8 books from their discipline.
  - a) II & III Degree students can have 4 books from their selected discipline and 2 from the general section (General English, Malayalam & Religion)
  - b) 1<sup>st</sup> Year Degree students can have 3 books from their discipline and 2 from the General Section (General English, Malayalam & Religion)
14. Every user is supposed to enter the details of the books and journals issued as well as referred in the issue register provided at the counter.
15. Students are not allowed to pass books from one person to another or lend to any one in or outside the College. In such cases they will be fined or suspended from membership.
16. A member of teaching staff is allowed to borrow 10 books at a time.
17. A member of non - teaching staff may borrow 4 books at a time from the Library.



18. Staff and students are expected to return their library books before due date.
19. The Library facilities are also extended to the old students considering the lack of library facilities in their locality.
20. Library has book bank facility for the poor students.
21. There are four browsing centers for the students at the located at the library. Two browsing centers are at the ground floor with our total of 25 computers and two are on the second floor with 39 systems. One of the browsing centers on the second floor was built as a part of the Ruby Jubilee year of Carmel college.

### **HOSTEL**

1. Students who do not live with parents, relatives or recognized guardians shall be required to live in hostels approved by the college authorities.
2. Every student shall within two weeks of joining fill up the residence slip and return it to the college office.
3. The hostel is under the direct control of the Principal, who stands as the local guardian to all in residence and under the immediate management of the warden.
4. Information regarding rules, peace etc. In there hostel can be had from the warden and from the college office.

### **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

The majority of the students at Carmel College receive some measure of financial aid during their career. The amount of support each student receives depends in part upon need; in part upon evidence of intellectual promises and achievements and in part of course upon the availability of funds. Support range from grants covering tuition charges and awards, sufficient to pay for all academic and living experiences.



**FEE CONCESSION & STIPEND**

Students belonging to Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes are eligible for full fee concession and stipend provided they apply for the same in time. Application forms are available from the office. Besides, mess charge of S.C. & S.T. students will be met by the government.

O.E.C. students - enjoy the same privileges as S. C./ S. T. students.

Students of forward communities are eligible for full fee concession provided their income falls below the income limit.

Students belonging O.B.C. are eligible for full fee concession, if their income fall under above limits.

Fee concessions to students whose parents are physically handicapped are eligible for tuition fees and special fee concessions from the social welfare department. The income limit is Rs. 12,000/-per annum.

The income certificate obtained from the village officer is a requisite to enjoy the above concession. It will have to be presented at the time of admission.

**STUDENTS AID FUND**

Assistance from the college student's aid fund is also available to those students whose family income is less than Rs. 1,200/- per annum. They shall apply before September.

**SCHOLARSHIPS**

1. The necessary information about scholarships is available from the college office.
2. Management Instituted Scholarships for abled Poor Students
3. No student will awarded more than one scholarship, college scholarship and concession.
4. A few poor students are given free education and noon meal by the management.
