The college started functioning on 3rd August 1981 and was formally inaugurated on 6rd February 1982 by Sri. K. Karunakaran, H'nble Chief Minister of Kerala. Carmel was started as a junior college with three batches of Pre-degree under the Calicut University. She was raised to the status of a 1rd grade college in the year 1984, with two degree courses, B.Sc. Mathematics and B.A. Sociology. Now the college has 16 Under Graduate courses and 8 P.G. courses.

COURSES

The Under Graduate Programs are offered under Choice Based Credit Semetser System. The duration of the Program is 6 semesters distributed in a period of 3 years. The odd semester will start in June and will end up in October and even semster will start in November and will end up in March. Each semster will have a minimum of 90 working days. EVALUATION

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts: (i) Internal Evaluation, (ii) External Evaluation. 20% weight shall be given to internal evaluation and 80% weight for external evaluation. Both internal and external evaluation will be carried out using direct grading system.

Components with percentage of marks of Internal Evaluation:

Attendance 25%, Assignment/Seminar/Viva 25% and test paper 50%

Practical Courses:-

Attendance 25%, Rocord 50% and Lab involvment 25%.

Deatails of grading Scheme

Evaluation (both internal and external) is carried out using Mark System.

The grading on the basis of a total internal and external marks will be indicated for each course and for each semester and for the entire programme.

Indirect Grading System based on 7 point scale is used to evaluate the performance of students.

- Each course is evaluated by assigning marks with a letter grade (A+,A,B,C,D,E or F) to that course by the method of indirect grading.
- An aggregate of E grade with 40% marks (after external and internal put together) is required in each course for a pass and also for awarding a degree.



 Appearence for Internal assessment (IA) and End Semester Evaluation (ESE-external) are compulsory and no grade shall be awarded to a candidate if she is absent for IA/ESE or both.

The NSS units of our college conduct regular and special camps, awareness classes, surveys and various other programmes for the volunteers and the society at large.

ALLINDIA CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY STUDENTS FEDERATION (AICUF)

We have a very enthusiastic and active AICUF unit functioning in our college from the year 1981 onwards. PROCEDURES

1. GENERAL RULES

Education in its true sense should comprise besides the acquisition of knowledge, the formation of an ideal character by bringing body, mind and heart under discipline and by developing everything that is good and beautiful in human nature. Hence it should be the earnest endeavour of every student. She should be gentle and refined in behaviour, polite and courteous in manners and modest in dress and comportment. The student's registration in the college is considered an expression of willingness to abide by all the rules and regulations prevailing in the college. Every student, therefore, is committed to the observance of these rules.

- Rules of modesty and decorum in dress should be strictly adhered to.
 A simple chain, a pair of earrings and a wrist watch may be worn.
 The students shall wear uniforms according to the directions given by the college authorities.
- It is the responsibility of the students to treat college property with care. They should help keep the buildings and campus neat and clean.
 Any damage done by a student to the property of the college or of others must be compensated either by repair or by replacement.
- 3. Students shall endeavour to preserve cleanliness and orderliness in the classrooms, verandahs and college premises. Dislocating chairs and other furniture, dirtying the surroundings by throwing bits of paper, and sprinkling ink on the floor, walls and furniture are not in keeping with the high sense of order and cleanliness expected of a lady. Congregating at the entrance of the college gate, sitting on the steps



- at the portico and sitting on the parapets create a bad impression and, therefore, are to be avoided.
- Books, stationary and umbrella should bear the name of the owner.
 The college will not be responsible for any loss of money or article incurred by the students through their carelessness. They are likewise forbidden to borrow or lend money or article.
- 5. No magazine, newspaper, mobile phone or walkman is allowed to be brought to the college or hostel without the permission of the principal. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the campus. Anybody carrying a phone is liable to punishment or fine or both and the phone will be confiscated. Use of mobile phones within the college building is a serious offence against the academic culture and hence it will invite punishment.
- Strict silence should be observed at all times in the reading room and library and in the classrooms during class hours.
- Attendance and active participation in all activities organized by the college is compulsory.
- No student should be seen in the verandah during the class hours.
- Irregular attendance, insubordination of lectures, habitual inattention
 to class work, obscenity in word or deed are sufficient reasons for
 the permanent or temporary dismissal of student. Minor offences are
 punishable by fines, loss of attendance etc.
- No subscriptions of any kind are allowed without the previous permission of the principal.
- Official letters addressed to college authorities should enclose reply postage.
- Students are not allowed to make complaints in a body or present any collective petition.



- 13. No notice should be pasted on the notice board without the permission of the principal. Important notices will be posted on the respective notice boards. It is the responsibility of the students to read these notices and to respond immediately if summoned through them. Students should read the notice put up on the notice board carefully everyday in the morning when they come and in the evening when they leave. All administrative, departmental and activity bulletin boards are for official use only. To tamper with them is a serious offence.
- The college does not charge any capitation fees nor does it accept any donation as a consideration for admission/appointment.
- Loss of working days due to unforeseen circumstances will be made up by extra Saturdays.
- 16. Students while in the campus should wear their identity cards and it must be produced for all transactions in the college.
- 17. Generally, no certificate will be issued in less than 48 hours notice.
- Fees once paid are not refundable.
- 19. Any student may be suspended, dismissed or expelled from the college at any time during the year for the following offences:
 - a) stealing
 - b) Any form of cheating or dishonesty
 - Any form of public immorality in campus or during a college function
 - d) Possessing or bringing into campus pomographic materials
 - Bringing alcoholic or any intoxicating beverages into the campus.
 Coming into the campus under the influence of alcohol or prohibited drugs and misbehaving



- f) Bringing or carrying within the campus fire arms or any lethal weapon.
- g) Physical assault on others.
- Gross and deliberate discourtesy to college personnel or students on or off the campus.
- i) Possession or use or trafficking of drugs on the campus.
- Vandalism in campus or of college property.
- k) Gambling on campus.
- Tampering with and /or falsification of school or public documents
- m) Preventing or threatening students or college staff or authorities from discharging their duties or from attending classes or from entering the college premises.
- 20. Study tours may be arranged for the final year students (III DC and II PG) with the consent of the class teacher and head of the department and prior approval of the principal. Students will not be allowed to go on tour unless they are accompanied by a member of the teaching staff.
- 21. Students are free to meet, write to and talk to the principal individually about issues related to them or the college administration. But they may not make any complaint in a body or through a collective petition.
- Students may not organize programmes for collecting funds nor may they make any kind of fund – collection in the campus, without the explicit prior permission of the principal.



Warning Against Ragging

Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Ragging means doing of any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution which causes or likely to cause physical or physiological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes:

- i) Teasing, abusing, or playing jokes on, or hurting, a student: or
- ii) Asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course willingly do

If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concern student will be given liberty to explain and if her explanation is not found satisfactory, the student will be expelled from the institution.

Any written complaint obtained regarding ragging will also be forwarded to the police authorities. College will not be responsible for the criminal proceedings initiated in this regard.

3. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- The working day is divided in to two sessions and each session into periods
 of one hour.
- The first bell for class is given 10 minutes before the commencement of the morning and afternoon session and the second bell at the hour fixed for the commencement of the class.
- At the first bell for the morning session, all students shall go to their classes for morning prayer.
- Late comers should enter the class with the permission of the Professor or Lecturer in charge of that class.
- 5. Daily Attendance will be taken.
- No student is allowed to leave class room without the permission of the lecturer in charge or until the class is dismissed.
- If a student wants to leave the college during class hours either the parent or guardian should come and get the permission from the principal.
- Office provides leave books on payment of Rs. 5/-Application for leave must be recommended by the tutor - in charge. In case of unforeseen circumstances application for leave must be submitted on the very first day of the students' return to the college.

- The students who absent herself for a day without leave, loses two days attendance. Absence without leave will be penalised at the discretion of the principal.
- 10. Absence without leave from examination and on the day of the reopening of the classes after holidays will be dealt with seriously. In case of illness, a Medical certificate should be produced. No re-examination will be conducted for the students who are absent during class tests and terminal examinations. Absenting students will lose the marks allotted for the particular exam. Their performance in other tests and examination will be the basis for their promotion or failure.
- A student requiring leave only for the particular hour may be granted such leave by the lecturer in charge.
- 12. Those who absent themselves without leave or those whose application for leave has not been sanctioned for any reason will have to pay a fine of Rs.1.00 per day. The fines should be paid along with the leave slip.

4. RELIGIOUS AND MORAL INSTRUCTIONS

- All Catholic students shall be required to attend the religious instruction at the appointed hours.
- All other students shall attend lectures on Ethics according to the timetable.
- Rules regarding attendance and leave for both these classes are the same as for ordinary college lectures.



COLLEGE LIBRARY

College Library is the source of Information and Knowledge for the academic community. The Carmel College Library has computerised searching facility for library holdings and circulation with barcodes. Internet browsing is provided in the Library.

The Library consists of:-

- Reference Section
- Periodical Section
- Internet facility
- Stack room with lending section
- Post Graduate Section
- Photocopying facility
- Book Bank

The Library Committee that includes the Principal, Vice Principal and teachers helps to direct the library Services.

LIBRARYRULES

- As the library is a place of individual study, students should conduct themselves inside the library as to maintian an atmosphere conducive to this. Strict silence must be observed in the library, reading room and its immediate premises.
- Books and other personal belongings should not be taken into the library. However each student may take papers with her.
- The library will be kept open from 8.00am to 5.00pm.
- Students without the identity card may not enter the library.
- The library follows open access system.
- 6. The time schedule for different sections in the library is as follows:-
 - a) Reference Section: 8.00am to 5.00pm
 - b) Periodicals & Journals: 8.00 am to 5.00pm



- Book Lending Section: 8.30am to 4.30pm
- d) Returning Section: till 11.30am
- e) Internet availability: 8.30am to 4.30pm
- 7. Due date is marked on the date label inside the book.
- If a book is not returned on the due date the student will be chaged Rs.
 1/-per day (Holidays inclusive) per book as fine.
- Library catalogues are available for reference at the counter, internet browsing, circulation and computerised searching facility for library holdings are available.
- 10. It is the duty of the borrowers to take maximum care of the library books issued to them. Please help us to keep the book fresh and clean.
 - Dog- earing the pages of a book, marking or writing therin with ink or pencil, tearing out of its pages, and spoiling of binding will constitute an injury to a book. Any such injury to a book is a serious offence. Unless the borrower points out the injury at the time of borrowing the books, she shall be required to replace the book or pay the price of the latest edition of the book including postage. It is left to the discretion of the authorities to press for a heavier penalty.
- 11. For loss of book the following procedure will be followed:-
- If new edition or copies of the lost books are available with the suppliers
 the book has to be replaced by a new one.
- If the lost book is not available for replacement the value of the lost book will be realised at the following rates:-
 - Thrice the face value of the book which are published prior to 1944
 - b) If the book value cannot be ascertained from the Library stock Registers, compensation will be fixed on the basis of the market price of similar publication at the time of fixation.
- Current periodicals, reference books, rare and out of print books will not be issued to be taken outside the Library.
- a) IInd P.G. Students are permitted to take 8 books from their discipline.



- b) I* P.G students are permitted to take 8 books from their discipline.
- c) II & III Degree students can have 4 books from their selected discipline and 2 from the general section (General English, Malayalam & Religion)
- d) 1st Year Degree Students can have 3 Books from their discipline and 2 from the General section (General English, Malayalam & Religion)
- 14. Every user is supposed to enter the details of the books and journals issued as well as referred in the issue register provided at the counter.
- 15. Students are not allowed to pass books from one person to another or lend to any one in or outside the college. In such cases they will be fined or suspended from membership.
- 16. A Member of teaching staff is allowed to borrow 10 books at a time.
- A member of Non-teaching staff may borrow 4 books at at time from the Library.
- 18. Staff and students are expected to return their library books and identity cards on terminating their services/studies from the Institution.
- The Library facilities are also extended to the old students considering the lack of library facilities in the locality.
- 20. Library has book bank facility for the poor students.

HOSTEL

- Students who do not live with either parents, relatives or recognised guardians shall be required to live in hostels approved by the college authorities.
- Every student shall within, the two week of joining fill up the Residence slip and return it to the college office.
- The hostel is under the direct control of the Principal, who stands as the local guardian to all in residence and under the immediate management of the warden.
- Information regarding rules, rate of fees etc. can be had from the warden and from the college office.



FINANCIALASSISTANCE

The majority of students at Carmel College receive some measure of financial aid during their career. The amount of support each student receives depends in part upon need; in part upon evidence of intellectual promises or achievements and in part of course, upon the availability of funds. Support range from grants covering tuition charges to awards, sufficient to pay all academic and living expenses.

FEE CONCESSION & STIPEND

Students belonging to Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes are eligible for full fee concession and stipend provided they apply for the same in time. Application forms are available from the office. Besides, mess charge of S.C & S.T students will be met by the government.

OECstudents - Christan converts from S.C.and Kudumbies - enjoy the same privileges as SC/ST students. There is no income limit for SC/ST students.

Students of forward communities are eligible for full fee concession provided their income falls below the income limit.

Post Graduate 1,00,000/-

Students belonging OBC are eligible for full fee concession, if their income fall under above limits.

Fee concession to students, whose parents are physically handicapped are eligible for tuition fee & special fee concessions from social welfare department. The income limit is Rs. 12,000/- per annum.

The income certificate obtained from the village officers is a requisite to enjoy the above concession. It will have to be presented at the time of admission.

STUDENTS AID FUND

Assistance from the college student's aid fund is also available to those students whose family income is less than Rs. 1,200/- per annum. They shall apply before September.



SCHOLARSHIPS

- The necessary information about scholarships is available from the college office.
- No student will be awarded more than one scholarship, college scholarship and concession.
- A few poor students are given free Education and noon meal by the management.
